Rapid City CHARACTER COUNTS! Coalition provides youth a framework for ethical living based on basic values called the Six Pillars of Character. Each month, a specific character trait is emphasized based on the Six Pillars of Character: trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship. Business partners are paired with an individual school to support the programming, not only financially, but also through the sharing of other resources, such as knowledge, leadership and positive role-modeling of good character. These Six Pillars of Character benefit our community by developing citizens who understand the value of good character in their lives.

In January, Rapid Valley Elementary focused on the character trait of fairness. Throughout the month, school principal Mrs. Cher Daniel and school counselor Mrs. Jeane Divich visited each classroom to describe the trait and gave examples. Students earn tickets each time they are seen exhibiting that character trait. A container is placed in each classroom, and at the end of the month, a ticket is drawn from the container. The student identified from that classroom is recognized and honored at a luncheon with employees from the Chiesman Center for Democracy.

The Chiesman Center for Democracy is a nonpartisan, nonprofit organization that serves as a forum to provide greater awareness of the meaning of democracy and the importance of active citizen participation in the democratic process. The Center promotes and supports greater awareness of democratic ideals by citizens and organizations by providing programming for civic participation, education and research.
